A LIFE-CHANGING PARTNERSHIP

You would think that after several years of partnering with God in doing what He asks us to do, that He would no longer surprise me, but actually ... it's just the opposite! He never ceases to amaze me and as I sit writing this, I'm once again overwhelmed by His incredible goodness, power, presence and love in our lives, individually and collectively.

I guess our story began a few months ago when a local senior sergeant started emailing and visiting the more than 100 Christian churches in the South Auckland area. He wanted to see how they could partner with churches in the prevention of crime and rehabilitation of young offenders. Sadly, after constant refusal and lack of replies he became disillusioned with the whole idea and gave up. That is, until Sel Seluone, who works with him, said he should try talking to us at Papsda. We saw God in that connection.

Since then, we have partnered with police in a number of different ways that led to a discussion around how we, as a local church, could best support them. One of the dreams they had was for local churches to open their doors to the vulnerable in our communities and we saw God at the centre of that dream. That dream led to lots of conversations ... and those conversations led to a discussion with our elder board ... and that discussion led to approval to open our facility every Thursday night (to begin with) to vulnerable people wanting help to change the trajectory of their lives ... and

we saw God in the willingness and unity of our team.

Planning began, more conversations, more lists and we realised we had none of the things we would need - no bedding, mattresses, sheets, blankets, pillows and towels – and no budget for any of those things. Our community team started messaging anyone they knew that might have a contact to purchase these things at a reduced rate. Kelley Tams' sister, Tania, just happens to be the CEO of Group Sourcing Support and TWL/WSL Merchandise at The Warehouse Ltd. Kelley asked if she could help at all. Her reply was, "If this works for you, we would be happy to donate the entire amount needed". "If this works for you"... haha! Oh it definitely works for us! WOW! We saw God in the amazing generosity of Tania and The Warehouse team.

"What if we tore down these walls ... our candle burns brightest in the dark ... and they loved each other with actions because words were unnecessary, and they chose to give this love away, but it still remained, no matter how much they gave." We saw God in Sarah Ryan's spoken word in a worship service five years ago (read it on page 8) and we see God in the living out of her words today. Let's continue to partner with God on His mission to radically change our community and in doing so, He will radically change us too.

AN AVALANCHE OF CRAZY LOVE

The more I think about our Kaitaia Crazy Love Service Tour (16-22 April 2018) the more I see how jam-packed it is with LOVE—sprinkled with a whole lot of CRAZY! Life-changing and impacting for myself, my crew, and a little community up north.

We kick-started our week of service with a crew of 12 young 360 leaders running a school holiday kids club in the hall of the local Seventh-day Adventist Church. Our theme this year was Avalanche Ranch—A Wild Ride Through God's Word. Our leaders were dressed in cowboy hats and vests ready to share the love of Jesus, and boy, was it a blast. From day one we had almost reached capacity with 45 children. As we progressed through the week what I loved the most was seeing a room full of kids on fire for Jesus, singing about Him and learning about Him. I also loved seeing our young leaders step up, some of whom began the week totally out of their comfort zone, but let God work in powerful ways in their lives to empower them to lead.

I also saw God working in the lives of the children. One of them was through a small 7-year-old boy named Sonny. After day three, Arona, one of our crew leaders, mentioned that one kid in his crew was asking for a Bible. I phoned Tracey to see if we had any at church we could give him and she said we might have enough Bibles to give to every child! I was so excited. At the finale, we were able to give every participant a certificate and a Bible to take home. All because of one child's desire to learn more about Jesus. Sometimes it only takes one small step to impact the lives of many.

We were joined by the rest of the 360 crew on Thursday and Friday. They spent the days painting, picking up rubbish, serving and making a difference in the community. On Saturday, Day7 blessed the church with a powerful worship service followed by lunch for the community, hosted by 360 back at the Marae where we were staying.

The week culminated with a Community Concert run by Resonate at the Te Ahu Centre in town. The opening act was performed by the children from the holiday programme. They smashed it! We also heard from a few local artists which was awesome.

Every year our vision and our why has always been to create an opportunity for our young people to experience Selfless Service. As a church, we value what it means to follow in the footsteps of Jesus in serving not for a reward but from a reward. The effects of living a life of service go far beyond the ones we are serving because ultimately it changes us.

From the bottom of my heart I'd love to thank everyone who served, cooked, drove, volunteered and helped make "Crazy Love '18" the great experience it was!



NEXT WEEK WE'RE OFF TO SOUTH AFRICA!

From 5-22 July, a team of 28
Papsda-ites are heading to South
Africa to make a difference. This is
our 5th trip to South Africa (our 4th
to Khomelela Community Centre)
since 2009.

The adult population has been decimated by AIDS and often children are left alone to fend for themselves. Older children are parenting their younger siblings. Many of these little children come to Khomelela for their one meal per day.

This time the team will be:

- Building a preschool for 110 AIDS orphans
- Providing in-service training for preschool teachers
- Providing in-service training for community healthcare workers
- Running a kids club for 200 kids
- Offering hope and encouragement to the team and the kids

At the recent charity auction on 26 May, we raised the target of \$20,000 to build the new preschool, PLUS an extra \$10,000 to build an extra toilet block.
